SUBJECT: Aid Reduction and Revenue Limit Adjustment Attributable to Incoming Choice Pupils

At your request, I am providing information about the aid reduction and the nonrecurring revenue limit adjustment for school districts attributable to incoming pupils in the Racine and statewide private school choice programs.

### Background

Under 2015 Act 55 (the 2015-16 biennial budget), school districts are permitted to count pupils who reside in the district and who begin participating in the Racine or statewide private school choice programs in the 2015-16 school year or thereafter, or "incoming pupils," for general aids on a prior year basis, and receive a revenue limit adjustment for each pupil equal to their base revenue per pupil for the current year.

Each district's equalization aid is reduced by an amount equal to the total amount paid by the state to Racine or statewide choice schools attributable to incoming pupils residing in that district in each year. In 2015-16, choice payments are equal to \$7,214 for a K-8 pupil and \$7,860 for a 9-12 pupil. Payments will increase by approximately \$109 in 2016-17, and in future years will increase by the revenue limit per pupil adjustment, if positive, provided to school districts in the current year plus the change in total categorical aid funding per pupil, if positive, from the prior year to the current year. School districts cannot levy to backfill the aid reduction. If the district does not receive an equalization aid payment sufficient to cover the aid reduction, the balance is reduced from other state aid received by the district.

### Choice Program Revenue Limit Adjustment

According to the Department of Public Instruction (DPI), in 2015-16, 142 districts received revenue limit adjustments totaling \$21.4 million attributable to incoming pupils in the Racine and statewide private school choice programs. This amount represents the maximum amount that

districts could choose to levy for choice pupils, of which districts actually levied \$19.8 million. The aid reductions for these districts for choice program payments totaled \$16.1 million.

The attachment shows the general aid reduction and revenue limit authority attributable to incoming choice pupils for each of the districts of choice pupil residence.
